God Almighty

El Shaddai is one of the earliest and most powerful revelations of God's name in all of the Bible. The word El is the singular form of Elohim. The word Shaddai suggests an inexhaustible

resource or bounty. So the name El-Shaddai means the one who supplies perfectly. Job is the only book to use El Shaddai extensively (31 times). The name was not used often after God gave Moses the name Yahweh. To a certain extent Yahweh replaced the name el Shaddai. While Paul uses the name Almighty for God occasionally, John refers to God in Revelation as "Almighty" nine times, once again giving a sense of the power of God in the final vision.

Names of Jesus

The names of Jesus show you the many different relationships you may have with Jesus. Consider these names when you pray. Remember, Jesus is the one who brings us to the Father. It is in Jesus that we know God.
