Apostle's Creed - The First Article
Lesson 3

The next three lessons will be studies of the Apostles' Creed. The word "creed" comes from the Latin credo. Lesson 2 gave the meaning for credo. What does it mean?

The Apostles' Creed is a Biblical statement of what Christians believe about the triune God. The Apostles' Creed is divided into three sections or articles. There is one article for each part of the Trinity. Article I deals with God the Father. Article II deals with God the Son. Article III deals with God the Holy Spirit.

This lesson will consider Article I. The study will include a discussion of what it means to believe in something and a study of God as the Creator. The last section will cover the Genesis account of creation and God as the preserver of His creation.

Actions Speak Louder Than Words
