The Apostle's Creed - Article II and Article III
Lesson 5

This lesson will continue the study of the Second Article. Two remaining phrases will be discussed. The lesson will also begin the study of the Third Article.

And Sitteth on the Right Hand of God the Father Almighty

Ephesians 1:20-23 establishes that Jesus is now at the right hand of God the Father. This is simply a returning to where Jesus was before He came to earth.

From Thence He Shall Come To Judge the Quick and the Dead

Jesus will return to earth. Look up Acts 1:11. How will Jesus return?

When will Jesus return? Look up Matthew 24:36 for the answer.

Jesus will judge all people when He returns. Read Matthew 25:31-46.

This may seem like our works are the basis for our salvation. The point is that the people who have a personal relationship with the Lord will do the things for others that are described in these verses. People without a relationship with the Lord will either not do these things or they will do them for the wrong reasons.

So, how does all of this apply in a person's life? The Second Article states who Jesus is, what He did, what He will do. At this time, this study will look more deeply into what Jesus did.

Jesus redeemed us when He died on the cross. We are in great need of being redeemed. The word "redeem" means "to buy back." When we say "Jesus redeemed us," we mean He bought us back. In order to be bought, a price must be paid.

If you, as a child, wandered away from your parents and got lost, you were in one place; and they were in another. You were separated. Sinful man is separated from God. He is lost.

Stealing is a crime against society's laws as well as God's law.

All sin is a crime against whom? _____

Are you guilty of sin? _____

If the answer to that last question is "yes," then you should be condemned to death and separation from God. For God's perfect goodness cannot tolerate sin. However, God, in His love and mercy, has provided a way out of the unhappy predicament we get into when we sin.

Phrased another way, Christ's death and suffering should be our death and suffering. Christ's physical and emotional pain should be our physical and emotional pain. Christ's separation from God should be our eternal separation from God. Jesus took our place. He is our substitute. He paid the price.

This is how we are made right before God. Only through Jesus is there salvation from what we all deserve. Faith in Jesus - that He did all this for me - is all it takes.

contribution. I owned a chain of stores, and I'm proud to say I treated everyone fairly. Why, if there ever were any complaints, I took care of them - free! After I retired, I helped with programs for the elderly. For as long as I could, I drove the van for the nursing home. I spent many an hour helping others. I've always tried to do what was right and fair.

My, it looks real nice over there. Oh, yes! I'm Jewish. I've been a good and faithful and religious Jew. I've observed all the holy days and festivals. I've kept the ten commandments or at least I've tried real hard. I confess I did do some coveting when Laura Peters - she lived next door to me right after I got married - got a new full-length fur coat. It was sooo gorgeous. Well, other than that, I've done real good. I've been faithful to the traditions of our forefathers. You know. Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Moses. Yea! I've been real faithful.

4. Is that really you St. Peter? Oh, my! I'm honored to meet you at last. You know, you don't really look like all those pictures of you. Why, last week at the ladies aid meeting at the Lutheran church, you know, I was saying to the ladies how I wondered how you guys really looked. Fancy that! Now I get to see you! Oh! Why should you let me in there? Well, doesn't that little book of yours have a list of all the things I've done at my church? It doesn't! Well, let me tell you. I've gone to church every single Sunday, just about, for as long as I can remember. I've taught Sunday School and Vacation Bible School for years. I've sung in the choir. I've been on practically every board and committee there has been. I've worked my tail off for that church! Are you sure there's no record of that in your little book? Well, there should be!

5. St. Peter? Right? This is kind of like a dream. I'm John Strong. I didn't really think all of this existed. About my life? I've done things my way. I've taken care of myself - never troubled anyone for anything. I've taken no handouts and asked no favors. The best way to sum up my life is this line from a poem I once read, "I am the captain of my fate, I am the master of my soul."

Why should you let me into heaven? I've always believed in God. I mean, he's the highest level of attainment, the force, the ultimate unity. All religions are pretty much the same anyway, aren't they? As for Jesus, he was a good teacher and role model for all humans. He had some great sayings. Yea. I've believed in God, but I kind of thought it would be different than this.

8. Hi there! I'm Nancy Nature. Oh. I've always believed in God. I mean, one look at all the beauty of the great earth let me know there is a God. I've spent many hours and days

contemplating God and the enormity and complexity of the universe. I never really believed in any specific doctrine. I've just always known, because of the beautiful flowers and mountains, that there is a creator somewhere.

Article Three, The Holy Spirit

"I believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen."

The remaining portion of this lesson will deal with the Holy Spirit and His role. The Holy Spirit is responsible for bringing us to faith in Jesus as our Lord and Redeemer.

Article Three concerns spiritual growth. The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity. Through the Holy Spirit (and only through the Holy Spirit) we come to faith in Jesus as our Lord and Savior. Look up 1 Corinthians 12:3. Can we possibly come to know Jesus as Lord without the Holy Spirit working in us?

How does the Holy Spirit make us able to believe in Jesus? He changes our hearts - our rebellious, unbelieving hearts. Only the Holy Spirit can turn our hearts to God.

We must also depend on the Holy Spirit to give us the power to live as God would have us live. And the Holy Spirit keeps us in our faith.

Here is the meaning for Article III. Read it.

"I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Ghost has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith; even as He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith; in which Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all sins to me and all believers and will at the Last Day raise up me and all the dead and give unto me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true."
